

An Awesome Easter Surprise

The sense of delighted surprise is wonderfully tangible in the gospel accounts when the disciples meet the risen Jesus. They are genuinely elated and thrilled as well as being awestruck.

This kind of beautiful 'Surprise' is something that often seems to characterise the Christian faith and the Christian experience.

Nicky Gumbel writes: "Surprised by joy' is how C.S. Lewis described his conversion from atheism to faith in Jesus Christ. He had never expected that there was any connection between God and joy. If anything, he had thought it would be the opposite: 'For all I knew, the total rejection of what I called joy might be one of the demands'. To his great surprise he found that following Jesus was the very opposite to what he expected. He experienced great joy through his new-found faith. He discovered that 'the heart of reality' is to be found in a Person. He was surprised by joy."

I can also testify that I have often found surprises of great joy as I have gone deeper into faith and deeper in my personal relationship with Jesus. This is not to say that faith is always easy, but there is often surprisingly great joy to be found along the way.

1 Cor 2v9: "What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived: [these are] the things God has prepared for those who love him"

... so God has surprises prepared for us!

I hope and pray that we know more and more of the surprising joy of meeting the risen Jesus as we rejoice and celebrate in His resurrection.

Catherine & Colm Ó Brolcháin Serving with OM Ireland

In 1957, George Verwer and two friends took a mission trip to Mexico. What began with three men who deeply desired to share God's love with those around the world who did not know it multiplied into a global movement of believers with the same passion. Originally called Send the Light, it became known as Operation Mobilisation in 1981. Today, more than 5,000 OM workers representing 134 nationalities are serving or in partnership in over 147 countries, in addition to onboard OM's ships.



Former members of Penrallt, Catherine and Colm now serve with OM Ireland, the headquarters of which is based at Lacken House, in County Roscommon, the very heart of the country. OM in Ireland officially launched in 2002 with the goal of supporting the Irish church. The vision of OM is to see many more vibrant communities of Jesus followers across the world. In Ireland, the number of people with an active faith is very small (estimated at 1.5% Operation World). To see this vision become reality, they offer training and resources to support small churches. Their other ministry emphasis is to give opportunities for people to receive practical training in Evangelism through a one- or two-week outreach in towns around Ireland. This enables participants to experience thought-provoking, creative, interactive training, then join an international team to share the message of the Gospel in word and action, together with local Christians.

There is also an annual timetable of regular outreaches at events like the National Ploughing Championships, the Irish Boat Festival, the traditional National music festival the 'Fleadh Cheoil' and the Appleby Horse Fair. One such outreach is around St Patrick's Day. This year, OM Ireland were joined by an amazing team of 12 people from five different countries to share the love of Jesus with others there in Ireland.

For more than two decades, the Big Red Bus, driven by Colm, has been an integral part of the ministry at OM Ireland. Its bright red exterior, banner of international flags, and vivid display of John 3:16 have been seen everywhere from Cork to Donegal, from Wales to England, and all places in between. But every ministry tool has its season and it has come time to say goodbye to the current Big Red Bus. Colm says, "The team will continue with our outreaches in the local towns/ communities, while working with churches and training people to spread the Good News. We are confident that the God, we serve, "who will never leave us or forsake us" has great plans for something special to replace the Big Red Bus. This will enable us to use the training, experience, knowledge, and time spent in meeting, ministry, and outreach, over the years, to effectively proclaim His Kingdom with whatever tools He provides for us!". OM Ireland are now in the exciting phase of looking for a new vehicle, to continue with a 'mobile' ministry, but it may not be a bus!

Catherine continues serving part time in Pastoral care, as well as supporting the team through the ups and downs of life on mission. If there is any time to spare, she gets stuck into anywhere there is a need like cooking and cleaning for the outreaches!

Catherine and Colm will be joining us on Sunday 14th April in the morning service to share some of what God is doing over in Ireland.
