New Series: Discipleship: How to become people who Love, Trust and Follow Jesus

When I was praying about this new series, I felt drawn to this idea that if we call ourselves Christians, then we are aiming to be followers of Christ. Not just in what we do, but in remodelling ourselves toward His character and His personality. I really felt that this focus wasn't simply going to be a list of rules or methodology – however helpful they are. But I couldn't quite see how it was going to work.

Then God really spoke to me at Fresh Streams – as he often does. I really sensed his love for me, his 'speaking tenderly' to me. It refreshed my relationship with Him. Yes, even at an online conference. When God really speaks to you it's quite arresting and exciting.

As the conference developed I got a sense that imitating Jesus, and becoming like Jesus should flow from our relationship with Jesus. Not by trying to follow a formula, but by <u>being</u> like him and because of a desire in our hearts.

Then Andy Glover spoke, saying that we want to be those who 'Love, Trust and Follow Jesus'.

I found this phrase strangely interesting. It gradually dawned on me that this was it. In order to follow Jesus, we have to trust Jesus. You are not going to truly follow someone that you don't trust. And in order to trust Jesus, we have to love Jesus. You're not going to truly trust someone that you don't love. In the meeting I wrote on the chat: "You have to Love before you can really trust. You have to trust before you can really follow. Do I really love? Do I really trust? Do I really follow? Do I need to go back to spend time with Jesus and love more? Do I need to wait on God and trust more? Do I need to listen and hear and follow more."

Towards the end of January Susan and Tony Burt, on behalf of Penrallt, attended a prayer meeting on Zoom, hosted by Bangor University's Christian Union. Rory, one of the student leaders, opened the meeting with a passage taken from Acts 16 (Paul's conversion of Lydia in Philippi). He then cleverly transferred the Bible passage from the first to the twenty first century – Philippi in Macedonia became Bangor in Gwynedd, and Lydia in Acts was transformed into Lydia a second year student at Bangor University. The message is as relevant now as it was then, in the midst of these difficult and uncertain times.

There were quite a few representatives from churches in the Bangor area (including AOG, Mosaic and Ebenezer), dividing into small groups to pray for the forthcoming CU mission, which will take place through six online presentations scheduled during the first fortnight in February. Tony writes: "It was an honour to take part, and to meet some delightful young Christians, on fire for God."

Bangor University Christian Union exists to give every student the opportunity to hear and respond to the great news of Jesus Christ. Coming into this semester, in a new lockdown, the CU needs your support and prayer with the upcoming missions weeks. Spreading across two weeks, from 2nd to 12th February, and focusing on the theme of 'Something More?', there will be a variety of livestreamed podcast discussions and Zoom talks, each followed by interactive question and discussion time.

- For our energy that despite being online, we can show the joy of the Gospel
- Most of all, that people will come along and will be saved
